

Executive Deputy to the Commanding General Mr. Gary Martin



As the Executive Deputy to the Commanding General of the U.S. Army Research, Development and Engineering Command Gary Martin directs the Army's intensified research, development and acquisition process for fielding technologies that sustain America's Army as the premier land force in the world. He assumed duties as the executive deputy in February 2008.

He holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering from Norwich University and a Master of Science in Engineering Management from the University of Pennsylvania, and graduated from the Program for Management Development at the Harvard Business School. His military education includes the Program Manager's Course at the Defense Systems Management College, the Signal Officer's Basic Course, and the Radio Systems Officer Course.

Formerly the Technical Director, Communications Electronics, Research Development and Engineering Center (CERDEC), located at Fort Monmouth, N.J., he was responsible for science and technology programs involving the development of advanced Command, Control, Communication, Computers, Intelligence and Information Warfare, and Night Vision & Electronic Sensors technology for the U.S. Army. Mr. Martin was also the Associate Director Technical Director, CERDEC; the Deputy Project Manager for Tactical Radio Communications Systems from May 2000 to July 2002; and the Acting Project Manager from Aug 2002 to June 2003.

During the period of Aug 1988 to April 2000, he held a variety of technical management positions within the office of the Project Manager MILSTAR, Project Manager Military Satellite Communications (PM MILSATCOM) and Project Manager Tactical Radio Communications Systems (PM TRCS). These positions included the Chief of Technical Management Division, PM TRCS, Chief, Technical Management Division at PM MILSATCOM, and Chief of Systems Engineering at PM MILSTAR.

Mr. Martin served on active duty as a Signal Corps Officer in the Satellite Communications Agency from May 1984 through May 1988. His awards include the Superior Civilian Service Award, the Commander's Award for Civilian Service, the Army Achievement Medal, the Army Commendation Medal and the Meritorious Service Medal. Mr. Martin is a member of the Armed Forces Communications Electronics Association, the Association of the United States Army and the Signal Corp Regimental Association.
